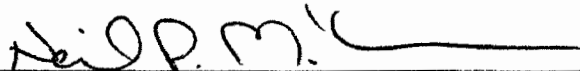

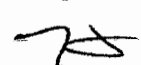
PER CURIAM. Pursuant to the August 18, 2003, order of the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit, the record is remanded to the Immigration Judge for further proceedings consistent with 8 C.F.R. § 1240.10(c), and consistent with the court's order. The respondent has asked that an attorney skilled in immigration law be appointed to represent him at his removal hearing. We note that the regulations require that the Department of Homeland Security (the "DHS," formerly the Immigration and Naturalization Service) assign an attorney to represent incompetent aliens in removal proceedings who are not accompanied by a guardian, relative, or friend. 8 C.F.R. § 1240.2(b). The respondent appeared alone at his earlier removal proceeding, and indicated that there was no guardian, relative or friend to assist him. The respondent therefore appears to be in the position that the DHS must assign an attorney to represent him.
